General measures and good manufacturing practices

- Regulation (EC) n°1935/2004 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 October 2004 on materials and articles intended to come into contact with food.
- Commission Regulation (EC) n°2023/2006 of 22 December 2006 on good manufacturing practice for materials and articles intended to come into contact with food.
- French Decree n°2007-766 of 10 May 2007 on the application of the Consumer Code in respect of materials and articles intended to come into contact with foodstuffs.
- French Decree n°92-631 of 8 July 1992 on materials and articles intended to come into contact with foodstuffs, products and beverages for human or animal consumption.

Plastic materials

- Commission Regulation (EU) n°10/2011 of 14 January 2011 on plastic materials and articles intended to come into contact with food.

Bisphenol A (BPA)

- Commission Regulation (EU) 2018/213 of 12 February 2018 on the use of bisphenol A in varnishes and coatings intended to come into contact with food and amending Regulation (EU) n°10/2011 as regards the use of that substance in plastic food contact materials
- French Law n°2012-1442 of 24 December 2012 on the suspension of the manufacture, import, export and placing on the market of any food packaging containing bisphenol A.

Environmental conformity

- Directive 94/62/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council of 20 December 1994 on packaging and packaging waste.
- Directive 2008/98/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council of 19 November 2008 on waste establishing a legal framework for the treatment of waste within the Community.
